

Action Required: In support of the IMO World Maritime Day, to be held on Thursday 26th September 2019, members are asked to download the film produced by ICS and share with your community.

The theme of IMO World Maritime Day 2019 is "Empowering Women in the Maritime Community".

Shipping Industry Representatives and IMO Join for Video Launch to Celebrate World Maritime Day

The shipping industry will join with IMO at its headquarters in London today to launch an engaging new video in celebration of this year's theme for World Maritime Day – 'Empowering Women in the Maritime Community'. The video has been created as a reminder of the important role that women play in shipping today, and more importantly to encourage more women to enter the industry and join the ranks of professional seafarers who play such an important part in the world economy.

Expected at the event will be senior representatives from all sectors of the shipping community, including shipowners, shipmanagers, NGOs, legal and finance specialists and educators.

In advance of the evening, Kitack Lim, Secretary-General of IMO said: "The theme of 'Empowering Women in the Maritime Community' resonates with us all, and we hope that this video will in turn empower our community to share this message through their businesses, via social media and with friends and family, so that it reaches a wide audience with many different backgrounds around the world."

ICS and its member organisations have a long-standing commitment to developing women in the shipping industry. In 2016 ICS endeavoured to collect for the first time in the industry definitive information on women seafarers in the shipping community. The latest ICS BIMCO Manpower Report predicts an increase in the number of women seafarers in coming years. It estimates that at the time of publication there were around 16,500 women seafarers forming part of the global supply of seafarers. It is equally positive that the largest percentage of women seafarers in the sample were in the process of training to be officers.

Earlier this year ICS helped kick off World Maritime Day activities when it co-hosted a special event on the theme of 'Empowering Women in the Maritime Community' which took place at IMO headquarters. ICS Secretary-General Guy Platten represented shipowners, moderating a panel discussion of prominent maritime figures who used their personal experiences to highlight some of the issues faced in this endeayour.

As Kitack Lim says: "The maritime community itself is missing out on a huge talent pool if it fails to properly empower women in the workplace. Gender-diverse teams are more productive than male dominated teams and gender-diverse workplaces promote better job satisfaction, employee

engagement and retention. Having more women in the workplace is beneficial for organisations as a whole, for men and for women."
